"Newson et al. (2003) define autism as a profound disorder in which the main role is played by the decay of language coding (or the allocation of the meaning) of any verbal construction"

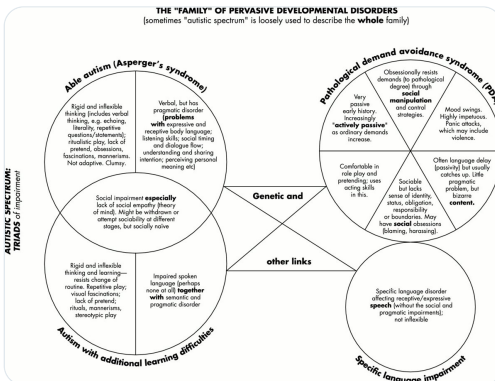
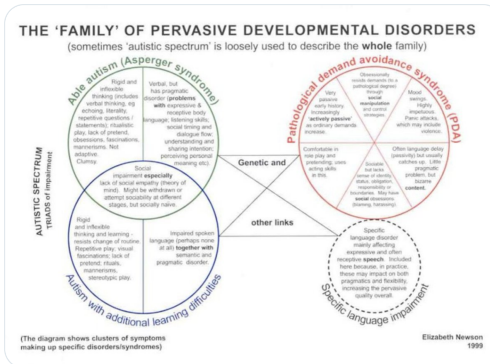
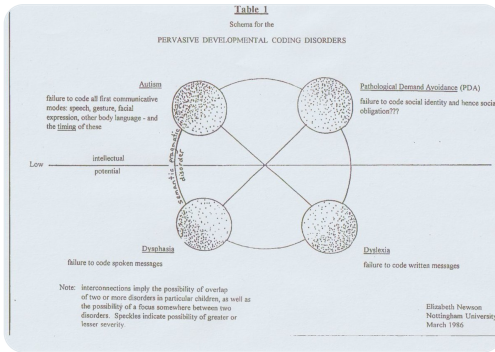
